Annual Certifications Annual certifications need to be completed before they expire to stay in compliance with K4K FFA and with CCL. If you have your certification completed in your certification month with no deficiencies your \$100.00 certification bonus will be issued in the following monthly reimbursement. If you have deficiencies you will forfeit your \$100.00 certification. Karing 4 kids completes four quarterly home inspections a year, therefore when your annual is due, you should remain in compliance.
